HYPERTENSION AMONG CANCER SURVIVORS IN CAMEROON: PREVALENCE AND ASSOCIATED FACTORS IN A SUB-SAHARAN AFRICAN POPULATION

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Background: Hypertension prevalence among cancer patients is high. However, there is paucity of data on the burden of hypertension among cancer survivors in Cameroon where both conditions are highly prevalent. **Objective:** We aimed to determine the prevalence of hypertension its associated factors among cancer survivors. **Methods:** A hospital-based cross-sectional study was carried out from January to April 2025. Hypertension was defined as an average of two BP measurements with readings $\geq 140/90$ mmHg, a previous diagnosis of hypertension, or current use of antihypertensive medication. Logistic regression analysis was performed to identify factors associated with hypertension.

Results: Out of the 425 patients with cancer, 150(35.3%) (95% CI: 31.1–39.5) were diagnosed with hypertension. Of these, 83 (55.3%) were newly diagnosed while 67 (44.6%) had a previous diagnosis of hypertension. Among the 67 previously diagnosed hypertensive cancer patients, 61(91%) were on anti-hypertensive treatment. Factors associated with hypertension included age 51-66 years (AOR= ≈ 4.85 , 95% CI: 1.47–16.07), age ≥ 67 years (AOR= ≈ 10.73 , 95% CI: 3.09–37.29), married (AOR=2.62, 95% CI: 1.45-4.72, $p = 0.001$), lung cancer (AOR= ≈ 4.68 , 95% CI: 1.07–20.48), dyslipidaemia (AOR= ≈ 3.06 , 95% CI: 1.49–6.26) and dermatologic cancers (AOR = 5.36, 95% CI: 1.06-26.94, $p = 0.042$).

Conclusion: Hypertension is highly prevalent among Cameroon cancer survivors. It is crucial to perform routine screening in cancer patients with accurate in and out of office blood pressure monitoring.
